She played at many concerts of church in Bavarian State, and got highly praised by Hof Zeitung in 1988. Played at Symphony Orchestra Greiz in Thueringen State. She moved to Muscut city in Sultanate of Oman in 1994 and returned to Japan in 1998. She lives in Kashiwa city.

### [Bassoon] Osamu Fukui

Osamu Fukui started playing the bassoon at the age of 15. Graduated from Tokyo College of Music in 1986 and started teaching at the same college. In 1989, he joined The Tokyo Symphony Orchestra and was accepted for Japan Wind and Percussion Competition. He has played as the first bassooninst since1993.

#### [Piano] Chiharu Okuda

Chiharu Okuda started playing the piano at the age of four. Majored in piano at Kyoto City Univ. of Arts and graduated from that university. Takahiro Sonoda, Kenichi Ara, Toshiko Kobayashi, and Makiko Takeda taught her. In 1988, she appeared with Kansai Philharmonic Orchestra. In 1990, she had a solo recital in Osaka. Today she is active in various fields mainly in Tsukuba.
